As we make this spring transition, this is also a good reminder to our boys to make sure they are in compliance with the hair cut policy.

The uniforms policy as stated on page 9 on the school handbook is:

Uniform shoes are to be <u>solid black</u> or <u>solid brown</u> leather slip on such as a Merrill or Mary Jane, saddle shoe, dirty buck or a penny loafer. Please no boat style shoes specifically Sperrys.

The following items are not included in the school uniform:

- Make-up, tattoos or body stickers, dark nail polish (light or clear polish only)
- Jewelry (with the exception of small earrings for girls only, one per ear)
- Extreme hairstyles (including Mohawks, drastic fades/undercuts) and accessories
- Boys must maintain a hair length of above their ears and eyebrows, and off the back collar
- Hair dye (only child's natural color hair is appropriate)
- Skorts and skirts must be no shorter than 2 inches above the knee.

#4 Tip for Lent

Examine your Conscience and Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation

WHAT?!? Examination of conscience and reconciliation?!? Okay, maybe you haven't been to confession in years, maybe you haven't been since your first confession ... That's ok. Our children will be going to confession this week on Thursday (4th through 8th grades) and Friday (2nd and 3rd grades). So now is an ideal time for you to treat yourself to a clean conscience too. Begin with this simple prayer:

Come, Holy Spirit, into my soul.

Show me my sins,
both the wrong that I did and the good I failed to do.

Give me the grace to be sorry for my sins

out of love for God,
so that through Confession my soul might be healed
and strengthened to do good.

Amen!

Then read the <u>Examen Using 10 Commandments</u>. Try saying the prayer then reading through the examen each day. For more encouragement you might want to watch:

Why Confess My Sins to a Priest?
Confession is a Place of Victory
Going to Confession for the First Time in a Long Time

The <u>steps</u> for receiving forgiveness are easy. The <u>Act of Contrition</u> prayer is posted in the confessional or you can ask the priest to help you. Confessions at St Pat's are in the church every Saturday from 4 to 5pm and during Lent on Mondays from 6:30 to 7:30. Please check out offerings at nearby parishes if these times don't work for you or if you would feel more comfortable elsewhere.

If you want to help your children get ready for their confession you can use the <u>Examen for Children</u> (they used this one at morning meeting today) or <u>this little book</u>. For more support try <u>this resource</u> with helpful tips and a video.
