Track & Field

Meets: Seven meets are being planned with the last being a championship meet. Meets are each Sunday from 2-4:30PM starting April 7 through May 19 at Walter Johnson HS or Gaithersburg HS. The meets are pretty flexible, so kids can show up and participate in as many or as few events as they want.

Practice: We plan to hold practice from 5-6PM on Wednesday and Friday each week so people can attend at least one of the practices. The first practice is **March 13**. Practice location is TBD but will be at a local high school track.

#3 Tip for Lent

Pray the Stations of the Cross

Every Friday in Lent our kids pray the Stations of the Cross in the church at 2:30pm. Since we have no school this Friday, why not pray the stations with your family at home? It will take you between 10 to 20 minutes depending on the version that you choose.

Why pray the Stations?

A simple answer is: Praying the stations reminds us of how much Jesus suffered for us, so it helps us to be grateful. And being grateful is one of the best ways to live a happy life. <u>Here</u> is what the Pope has to say about why we should pray the stations.

<u>Here</u> is more history, instructions and resources about the stations of the cross.

How do we pray the stations?

For very young children, we suggest some coloring pages. <u>This version</u> costs \$5 to download on Etsy and is a nice one for younger students.

Here is another one on Amazon that is also \$5.

<u>This version</u> is a GREAT one for older kids and adults, it has clear simple language AND, it's a bargain on Amazon for \$1.75 (get a few.) It was written by a Deacon from Washington D.C.

This one at the Catholic Company might be more appealing for older kids.

Where and when can I pray the stations?

You can pray the stations anytime at home or at church. At St. Pat's we have stations inside the church along the walls and outside along the sidewalk on the right side of the building. You can also attend the stations at St. Patrick's. *They are prayed every Friday night during Lent at 7pm. Families and children are most welcome.* It takes about 30 minutes. Booklets are provided at the back of the church.
