FACTS Updates 2025-2026 Sy

FACTS will now offer the option to pay all school tuition by credit card or establish an account to submit banking information for monthly automatic withdrawal. There are fees associated with creating accounts.

- Credit Card fees of 2.95% will be passed on to parents using credit card payments for school tuition.
- There are no added fees if a family chooses automatic withdrawal from a checking or savings account.
- FACTS for tuition payments (annual fee per family account).
 yearly or semesterly payment options=\$20 fee
 10 or 12 month payment options=\$50 fee

Families who wish to avoid the fees associated with creating a FACTS account for tuition payment must contact Miss Short by January 3rd. The default setting is for FACTS to assist with your tuition collection.
